### RESEARCH PROJECTS:

- 2010 **Pain Study.** Pilot study based on subjective assessments of pain and pain relief, as experienced by radon health mine clients. Uses the Wong-Baker FACES Pain Scale to quantify pain, and uses a questionnaire to record symptoms, medications, and treatments used, as well as basic demographic information about the study population.
- 2008 **Folklore and Healing: Poetry, Letters, and Narratives from Montana Radon Health Mines.** Collection and analysis of the many poems, paintings, and graffiti left behind on the walls of Montana radon health mines over the last 50 years by arthritis sufferers seeking pain relief. Collection and analysis of narratives told by recent radon mine clients.
- 2007 **WECARE (Working to Enhance the Care and Resources for Elders) Project.** Co-investigator in a three-year project to systematically evaluate the ongoing WECARE project's efficacy. This project was funded by the California Service Corps and sponsored by AmeriCorps. My role was to conduct ethnographic interviews of selected elderly participants.

The purpose of this pilot study was to evaluate data from specific blood tests taken before and after a ten day regimen of radon therapy in a Montana Health Mine. This study used a small number of participants with the aim to ascertain (1) the willingness of mine visitors to obtain the blood tests; and (2) if there are any significant changes in blood chemistry that would warrant future grant application for major funding. This proposal submitted to CSUF IRB for review in August 2006 (provisionally accepted in September 2006).

Conducted pilot study assessing range of motion in arthritis sufferers before, during, and after they had used radon therapy at my ongoing research site, a radon health mine in Montana. Collected demographic data on 2000 individuals, along with historical and archival information. (HSR#: 05-2139). A graduate student intern was hired to assist with data collection.

Ethnographic data collected included perceptions of chronically ill elderly regarding institutions and organizations that affect their ability to use radon, such as the American Medical Association and the Environmental Protection Agency.

A study of the explanatory models of radioactive radon gas held by clientele visiting played-out gold mines for health purposes, and of the experiences and decisions that lead them to

try radon therapy. Continuing work from this project focuses on the economic boom caused by radon therapy in the 1950s among small mining towns, and how legislation and/or Environmental Protection Agency standards, as well as the position of the American Medical Association on radon therapy, has affected, and will continue to affect, the ability of these mines to stay in business.

**2000-01 Dissertation field research in Germany, Austria, & Czech Republic**

Short comparative visits to radon mines and spas in Europe, where radon therapy is an accepted form of treatment, prescribed by some doctors and covered by health insurance. Investigation of radon therapy in Europe as provided at clinics, often in historically important spa towns where these clinics are an important part of the local economy. Interviews with clinic supervisors and physicians who prescribe radon, and tours of the facilities where radon is applied, and some interviews with patients.
